The group was A led by Lorelei and Sammy Mah, our long time friends who have helped us ever since we started Vamonos. They worked with us installing the plumbing for all the buildings of A the camp. They have three grown children,

but when the kids were in middle school and high school they came for weeks at a time working on whatever needs we had. We loved them then, and still do! Nicole their oldest daughter and her husband, Dan, were on this trip. What a treat to see them and the way they were challenged over the course of the week.

On Sunday morning, we attended service at the El Camino church. There were lots of hugs, music and a great service. One of the guys from the church was really good leading the worship and had a great singing voice. His name was Nacho and he came to the VBS the next day with his wife and little girl. He started to talk to George and told him he attended a VBS when he was a small

boy and remembered a magic trick George used to teach the children about sin, and that Jesus was the only one who could take away that sin. He still remembered all the songs we sang so many years ago. He also told George that he, his wife and little girl go down to southern Mexico, where they have family, and hold a week long VBS every summer. George was overwhelmed. the church and doing VBS hours away from Reynosa. The next day, Jan was leading some songs at the VBS and two ladies came up after the VBS and said they remembered her teaching songs, and Bible lessons. They brought their children to the VBS and were happy to hear their children singing the same songs they used to. But most of all that they were hearing the Bible lessons. They don't attend the church but said they would start.

Please pray they will. When you give your life to God he uses you, but many times you don't see the fruit. We are thanking God for giving us that special gift.

By the end of the week, the bulk of the work was completed, and we averaged over 80 children a day in VBS. Pastors David and Marlene were very happy, excited and sad the group was leaving. They held a prayer time for the group and many lives were changed and challenged. Sometimes we think mission trips are all about helping the people we came to serve. But we have seen many changes and challenges for people who feel God calling them to change their lives and even their jobs. Our first mission trip was to the Dominican Republic. We went to help our son who was the youth pastor of our church, but God was sending us to make a change in our lives. Four years later

Then we will spent time in Brighton visiting our son, daughter in law and two grandchildren. We will also spend some time visiting some supporters and George's brother. We so look forward to visiting our family. Please pray as we travel around that it will be a real blessed time.

When we arrive home we will get ready for three groups coming in July. Usually we have groups coming in June, but this year they will be coming later, as the schools in Reynosa don't get out until the end of June, so we don't get many kids for VBS. We praise God for keeping us healthy and eager to do His will.
